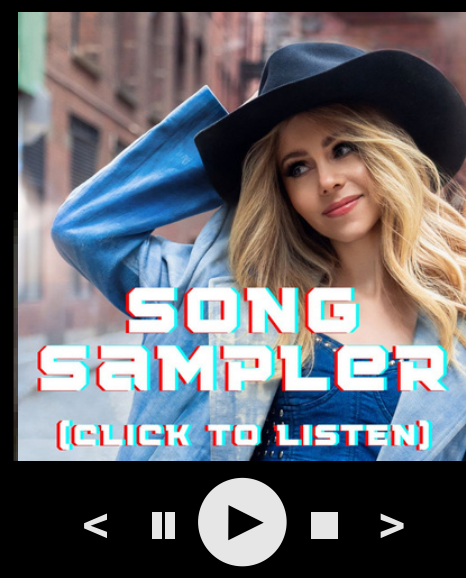


BROOKE MORIBER



Brooke Moriber is a singer/songwriter and native New Yorker who has carved a unique path in Country music. A former Broadway performer, Brooke began writing songs as a teen to cope with a rare eye disease that took her sight for four years—an experience that shaped her powerful storytelling voice.
